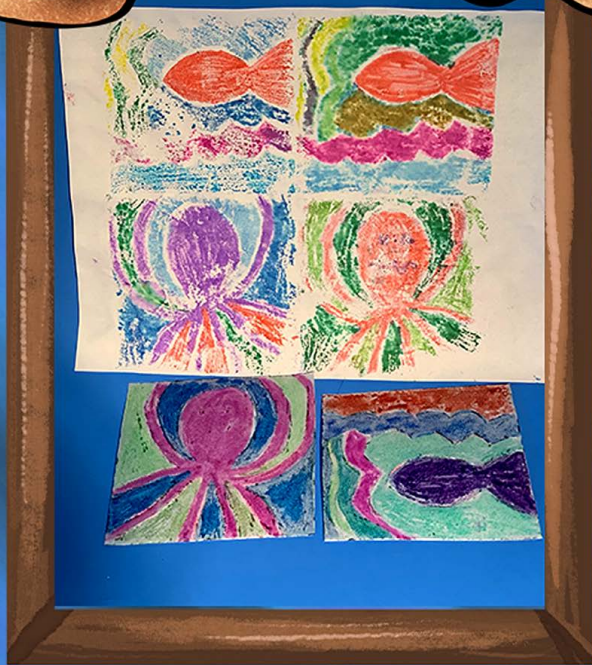


**"PRINTED" OCEAN SCENES**



**MATERIALS:**

- 1 Piece of Recycled Styrofoam (take-out box or plate or Styrofoam tray)
- 1 Dull Pencil (or back of a paint brush)
- Scissors
- Washable Markers
- White Paper
- Spray Bottle of Water OR Damp Paper
- Towel or Napkin



**DIRECTIONS:**

1. Cut a flat piece of Styrofoam. This can be a square, a circle or any shape you'd like! Using the dull pencil OR back of the paintbrush, etch an ocean scene design into the Styrofoam (or any design you'd like!).

2. Color in your design with washable markers. Don't worry if you color the lines.

3. Dampen the blank paper with the spray bottle or wet paper towel. You can experiment with levels of dampness. The wetter the paper, the more vibrant your design will be. (But it might not be as clear).

**NOTE:** Make sure you wet the paper, NOT the Styrofoam you just colored.

4. Place your Styrofoam with the colored side down on the damp paper.

5. Rub the back of the Styrofoam with the handle of your scissors.

6. Carefully, peel up the Styrofoam and admire your print!

7. Color in your Styrofoam again with the markers and make more prints. (You might have to dampen the paper again)
